Offense Description: Solicitation of Children to Engage in Sexual Conduct

SENTENCE DETAILS: COUNT 1

Commit to Commissioner of Corrections

Ordered on October 14, 2025:

- Commit to Commissioner of Corrections at the MN Correctional Facility - St. Cloud for 20 months.
Sentence is stayed for 5 years.

This sentence consists of a minimum term of imprisonment equal to two-thirds of the total executed sentence, and a maximum supervised release term equal to one-third of the total executed sentence, unless the sentence is life or life without the possibility of release.

Local Confinement

Ordered on October 14, 2025:

- Defendant is sentenced to 60 days in the Le Sueur County Jail.
Defendant is to serve 60 days.
Credit for time served amount is 3 days.

Monitoring

Ordered on October 14, 2025:

- Defendant is placed on supervised probation for 5 years, monitored by Department of Corrections - Probation & Parole.

Conditions

Ordered on October 14, 2025:

Defendant must comply with the following conditions:

- Follow all State and Federal criminal laws.
- Contact your probation officer as directed.
- Tell your probation officer within 72 hours if you have contact with law enforcement.
- Tell your probation officer within 72 hours if you are charged with any new crime.
- Tell your probation officer within 72 hours if you change your address, employment, or telephone number.
- Cooperate with the search of your person, residence, vehicle, workplace, property, and things as directed by your probation officer.
- Sign releases of information as directed.
- Give a DNA sample when directed.
- Do not use or possess firearms, ammunition or explosives
- Obtain Permission from Agent before leaving the State
- No alcohol/controlled substance use With the exception of prescribed medications.
- No possession of alcohol or drugs With the exception of prescribed medications.
- No mood-altering chemicals unless prescribed by a doctor
- Random testing Shall submit to random chemical testing at request of probation or law enforcement.
- Psychological-Sexual Evaluation and follow all recommendations including aftercare.
- Not Possess/Use Any Pornographic/Sexually Explicit Material
- No Access To or Use of Internet Without Approval No use or possession on a computer or internet or any device capable including cell phone and gaming systems unless approved by probation
- No Social Media, No Internet No use of internet chat rooms, dating sites, or social media sites.
- No contact with persons under age 18 unless approved by probation
- -Comply with monitoring software as directed by agent
- Predatory offender registration required Comply with Predatory Offender registration including photographing, fingerprinting, and DNA
- Submit to Polygraph Examinations as Directed
- No assault Do not engage in any assaultive, abusive or aggressive behavior
- Cognitive skill training as directed by your agent
